



Directions to All SCHPA Locations

Clover

- From downtown Clover: Take Hwy 55 east approximately 1 mile turn right on Quinn road across from the shopping center. Clover recreation complex entrance is located 3 blocks on right.

Florence

- Approaching Florence on eastbound I20 take I95 south exit onto Hwy 76 east; keep going till you see a mini maxi warehouse sign and check cashing business on the right; turn right on Santiago drive. McCleod Park is located on the left; the courts are visible from the road.

Hickory Grove

- From the southeast – turn off of Hwy 49 at Sharon onto Hwy 211 follow Hwy 211 about 6 miles to Hickory Grove, the courts are located in the park on the right, past the armory.
- From northwest - I-85/Blacksburg take Hwy 55 south to intersection of Hwy 97, proceed on Hwy 97 to Smyrna. Continue on Hwy 97 about 4.8 miles. The courts are located in the park on the left before the armory.

Hartsville

- From Hwy 151 by-pass, look for Pam's Restaurant and the Action Ford dealer, turn north onto Fourteenth Street, towards Hartsville. Byerly Park is located at the corner of Fourteenth St. and Russell Rd.

Newberry

- Located off I26, from interstate take Hwy 121 at exit #72, from either direction and go toward Newberry. Follow Hwy 121 for approximately 2 1/2 miles. Stay on Hwy 121 when it turns right at the traffic signal; proceed 1/2 mile and Marion Davis Park is on left.
- From Union take Hwy 176 to Whitmire, then Hwy 121 to Newberry. When Hwy 176 crosses I-26 follow above directions.

York

- From I-85, go south on Hwy 321 about 18 miles, turn left onto Hwy 5 by-pass. Go approximately 3 miles, turn right at traffic signal (Hwy 49). Continue 3/4 mile and turn left onto Ross-Cannon St., after approximately 1 mile and you will see the light poles of the York Recreational Complex, on the left.
- From Columbia, travel north on Hwy 321, at the edge of town, turn onto Hwy 49 and go all the way through town. as you leave town on 49, turn right onto Ross-Cannon St.; after approximately 1 mile and you will see the light poles of the York Recreational Complex, at park on the left.
